I, Steve Best, declare as follows:

- I am currently employed by International Business Machines Corporation
 ("IBM") as a Senior Software Engineer for the Linux Technology Center ("LTC"). I have
 worked for IBM since 1984, and within the LTC since October 1999.
- This declaration is submitted in connection with the lawsuit brought by The SCO
 Group, Inc. ("SCO") against IBM, titled <u>The SCO Group, Inc. v. International Business</u>
 <u>Machines Corporation</u>, Civil No. 2:03CV-0294 DAK (D. Utah 2003). I make this declaration based upon personal knowledge.
- I understand that SCO has alleged in Item 1 of its Final Disclosures that I
 disclosed the "AIX JFS Journaling File System" to Linux. I did not.
- 4. In November 1999, I led a project to port JFS code from IBM's OS/2 operating system to Linux. This code was not from IBM's AIX operating system. IBM also made additional contributions to JFS for Linux that were not based on either OS/2 or AIX,
- 5. During the same time period as IBM's contribution of OS/2-based JFS code to Linux, IBM also added OS/2-based JFS code to AIX. For this reason, the Linux JFS is sometimes mistakenly-believed to have originated from AIX.
- 6. The JFS code that IBM contributed to Linux was original IBM work; it did not include any System V code; it was not a modification or derivative work of System V or based on System V; and it was not written with reference to System V. IBM's contributions to JFS for Linux were based on the creativity and general programming experience of IBM's programmers, including myself.

- OS/2 does not include any Unix System V code, and it was not based on Unix
 System V. It is original to IBM.
- 8. Christoph Hellwig was the leading non-IBM contributor to Linux JFS project.

 Mr. Hellwig was a Caldera employee at the time.
- I declare under penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States that the foregoing is true and correct.
