I, Ben Rafanello, declare as follows:

- I am currently employed by International Business Machines Corporation
 ("IBM") as a Senior Software Engineer for the Systems & Technology Group. I have worked for IBM since 1994.
- 2. This declaration is submitted in connection with the lawsuit brought by The SCO Group, Inc. ("SCO") against IBM, titled The SCO Group, Inc. v. International Business

 Machines Corporation, Civil No. 2:03CV-0294 DAK (D. Utah 2003). I make this declaration based upon personal knowledge.
- 3. I understand that SCO has alleged in Item 1 of its Final Disclosures that I disclosed the "AIX JFS Journaling File System" to Linux. I did not.
- 4. In 1999, I joined the Linux Technology Center ("LTC") working on the JFS team.
 IBM has contributed certain JFS code to Linux from IBM's OS/2 operating system, not from AIX.
- 5. To the best of my knowledge, the JFS code that IBM contributed to Linux was original IBM work; it did not include any System V code; it was not a modification or derivative work of System V or based on System V; and it was not written with reference to System V. I believe that IBM's contributions to JFS for Linux during my tenure on the project were based on the creativity and general programming experience of IBM's programmers, including myself.
