3. Develop management skills and grow employee job skills so that most all future positions are filled from within the company.
4. While maintaining our strength in current distribution, support, and services, take an aggressive leadership role in defining / changing these structures to support IAYF users. Be the agent of change in defining and implementing new distribution techniques and channels, service and support methods.
5. Pick a reasonable number of long term key strategic partners and insure that we develop win - win strategies to complement the relationships.
6. As we grow, do all possible to maintain the Microsoft culture.
7. Improve development processes to achieve concurrent announcement and shipment of products to all major countries and to all other chosen markets within 90 days.
8. Create the atmosphere and benefit structure that will retain employees for the long term.
