Let us try to make some progress this week on this before we try to meet. The solution here isn't as simple as just leaving it cut of Win 3.1 as some suggest. I'd rather ship a non-perfect style guide than not ship a perfect one. The short term issue here is figuring how much we can get done for Win 3.1 and who will do it. You probably already know this, but just want to say that the NT/Nin32 folks already have a draft design which would cover this area. The have developed a "configuration registry" detabase which would store information like available or used UNB memory and a corresponding set of general API which apps, dll's, and/or drivers could use to produce such information.

Keith Logan and Bryan Willman wrote the spec.

It is their hope that "we" use this same scheme for DOS/Win32, and they did the design with that in mind. If you are thinking of doing samething for DOS 5.x or the like, we should probably take a look at their design and think about how we would migrate (assuming we choose to do this).
