For those interested, the Gateway 2000 applications license (signed by Gateway a couple of weeks ago) is fully executed with Mikehal's signature this morning. All is complete contractually, Gateway is shipping and all seems to be well (except for with their competition).

In the briefest summary possible, the agreement is a per system apps and languages license with a min commit of \$12M over 12 months. No per product commit, but a commit to ship one of our apps or group of apps with all Windows systems (over 99% of all system shipments). All apps or group of apps as they are marketing them carry a retail value of around \$500+/-. This should conservatively put Gateway at \$40M in revenue over the next twelve months with all licenses in place including MS-DOS, Windows and Mouse. Suddenly Microsoft's largest OEM and by a large margin. 12 months. No per product commit, but a commit margin.


