My name is Lynn Krueger. I'm the Assistant Manager for the MS Consultant Relations Program (CRP), in the Channel Marketing/Services Group. To join the CRP an independent computer consultant must take a minimum of two exams (Dos/MicroHardware and Windows 3.1) through Sandraj's Microsoft Certification Program.

A consultant by the name of Alex Howard is pursuing membership in the CRP and has asked me to waive the required entrance exams. This is not a standard policy, however if you were to agree then we will waive the exams.

In a letter that was send to you Mr. Brown stated, "After beta testing Windows 3.1 since June of 1991 and using and manipulating DOS 5.0 (as can be demonstrated by reading my numerous reports), I believe I have already qualified for this Associate membership" in the CRP. And in a letter send to me, Mr. Howard said, "Brad Siverberg had me placed into a subset of the 15,000 tester; this subset numbered 200. It was to this smaller group that a new beta buid was sent in advance of the entire 15,000 testers. I also was selected as one of fifty to receive the written documentation for proofreading and review."

Grayson went so far as to say that they are now running their internal apps on OS/2 because the can do in "3 seconds" what they could before only do "in 20 seconds" for phone service reps.

They handed out of book of 800 (yes, 800) press releases of folks that are "committing" to do 32bit PM apps (I did not get a copy - did anyone else?). Lotus, WP, Borland said that they would all do 32bit PM apps to ship "later this year", and said how much better these apps would be than their Windows apps. Philip's latest line: "We wrote Windows applications, but we didn't inhale".
