if they really release a version with all this junk in it, it will mean that for three ms-dos releases in a row (5, 6 and 7), DR will have had our key features in their product 12-18 months before us (kernel in HMA, compression, VxD/multitasking), given that track record, it's going to be impossible to shake this "MS as follower" image.
