Any day (I've been saying this since November) there's supposed to be a new option on the IEAK web site that licenses ISVs to redistribute the minimum install, requires silent setup, no customization allowed/possible, gives the ISV the option of putting the IE icon on the desktop. ISVs have to install at least the minimal installation IE to get the components you mention. Without getting too much into the details one of the primary reasons is that allowing ISVs to pick and choose IE component from IE3 caused huge support headaches for both the ISVs and for us

There are two ways the installation can be done. The first is through the IEAK as Stawsh mentions below This allows them to configure and brand IE as they'd like, but also has requirements the ISV must follow through the licensing agreement (i.e. reporting). The second is by using the setup package and license agreement that ships with the INetSDK. This installation can't be modified at all, but the bonus is that it can be configured to do a silent install so the user is never aware that it even happened

Subject: MSIE issue for AutoCAD

Nancy

First, I would like to thank you for making the trip down to San Rafael. I really hope that we can improve the relationship between Microsoft and Autodesk. I will be talking with both Milt Capsimalis and Meryl Dean about arranging a trip to Redmond for some of our AutoCAD marketing people, hopefully in the near future

However, there is one issue which I brought up at our meeting that I really need to pursue with either or both you and Daniel. The issue has to do with a forced full MSIE install just to use your browser controls

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MS-PCA 2563848

The AutoCAD engineering team would like to just install the browser controls associated with MSIE, in order to WEB-enable AutoCAD for our next release. We have considered a full MSIE install and even tried this with our AutoCAD LT release, for HTML help, a number of month back, but this caused a lot of backlash in our user community. We have even dropped our plans to support HTML in the next version of AutoCAD because of this backlash.

We believe that your controls are the right way to go, but I can't force a full MSIE install on my customers just to WEB-enable their AutoCADs or allow HTML help. So we would like to obtain permission to install just your browser contols. The controls or modules that we are interested in are:

SHDOCVW.DLL MSHTML.DLL INETCPL.CPL

I need to resolve this issue immediately
