I do not believe corporate has done anything yet but they are starting to get the message since NT with MTS and MSMQ is not even being considered an application server to compete vs KIVA. Scott, Can you provide some info on this...actually with the announcements on AOL today taking over Netscape - - and especially Sun perhaps licensing use of the the Netscape commerce software (which they acquired from KIVA) from AOL - - this should be a hot issue for any customer who was looking at this solution. There is a huge leap for AOL and Sun to integrate the KIVA solution into their platform. It's not at all like the IBM acquisition of LOTUS where IBM let LOTUS stay their "own company" with it's own identity and go forward because LOTUS had a fully formed solutionand strategy.

Netscape never really strategized their KIVA acquisition nor did they ever really integrate it and have a coherent story although they played it for all it was worth. AOL and Sun, as it remains to be seen, will have a lot on their hands to make this a truly integrated and operable solution and it will take some time. We need to play this for all it's worth at this time. Larry should really understand the issues from an industry perspective....Scott understands the technical side.

Aubrey Edwards used to work this angle when he was with CATM as I've met with him on this in the past. Aubrey, who should we deal with on the CATM side for this perspective going forward?
