I think we should force the windows and os/2 business back toward the
own model.

with dos, their was no concept really of a generic dos--since there
were many issues related to real compatibility. As such it was risky
to buy some other one's dos to run on brand x machine. the chances
are it would have problems. so I believe leakage wasn't severe
(I'm not helped by the fact that IBM basic didn't work without the
IBM rom--maybe more a perceptual thing than a real market issue but
it contributes to the feeling that you shouldn't try to run someone
elses dos on a different machine.)

Along these lines--we could ask IBM to restrict their core so offerings
to only running on their systems (either a rom check or not testing
on other systems).. the biggest leakage problem is IBM onto other
M/V. This would save the accounting nightmare.

I don't think a parallel requirement for other oses is necessary.
the other oses and conflict over retail windows and the rom.

I would propose a 2 year transition where we would phase out retail
stand-alone windows if IBM agrees to work to installing windows on
the hardware for 286 and 386 machines over the next 2 years.

then we could merge the dos rom and windows rom, so the only
market where leakage is an issue is the upgrade market. I would propose
just leaving this out of the discussions of cross royalties etc.
the dos/rom rom would need an existing version of dos on the system
in order to install itself.

that's it. I like the rest of the proposal

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
