Issue

This mail is intended to address three key goals for Astro (MS-DOS 6). They are:

1. Increasing OEM royalties
2. Help OEMs' keep their cogs down
3. License source for compression in particular but some of our other cool utilities if possible to IBM under our terms rather than the current IBM contract terms. This is important b/c we do not want to give IBM compression they can use for OS/2 or another product or even allow them to sell a stand-alone compression product (which the current contract allows them to do)

Recommendations

Much as we do now with the MS-DOS shell we would offer OEMs some key utilities as an add-on to MS-DOS 6. They could license the "Standard MS-DOS 6" for some price and for say \$2 more per unit they could get what I would call here the "utility pak".

The utility pak would consist of MS-DOS & Windows Back-up, MS-DOS & Windows Anti-virus, compression, Windows undelete, the MS-DOS shell and slalom.

|| We need to create a seperate install for only the base
|| product. We also need to modularize our documentation so that
|| we have a solution for each case. With some effort we believe
|| we can do both without changing our RTM.

|| Saving COGS
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|| As you know we are also working on a MS-DOS 6/Win 3.1 combined
|| product (code name Jastro). We will provide these docs and
|| install as an option to OEMs shipping Windows and MS-DOS 6.
|| They can save on disk space by choosing to not ship the MS-DOS
|| versions of back-up, undelete and anti-virus and by using our
|| documentation.
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|| The MS-DOS 6 Upgrade would stay as planned, there would be
|| only one version and it would contain all components.
|| Ideally, MS-DOS 6 Package Product and Easy product would also
|| only be available in one version that contained everything
|| although we may have to make some compromises there as I
|| explain below.

|| This plan has been developed in conjunction with joachimk and
|| the OEM directors and has been discussed with Paul. OEM
|| believes that breaking off some of the utilities will give us
|| our best shot at increasing total MS-DOS royalties or at least
|| keeping them at their current levels. This is because the
|| utility pak will be very compelling and they expect a majority
|| of OEMs to go for it if we price it aggressively. Ironically
|| any user who gets the base version is still a candidate to buy
|| our Upgrade product. Also the base product may give us
|| something we can be aggressive with if we need to match DR DOS
|| in an account where price is the only issue.

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
