One of the big reasons the ISVs complain is because we don't give them early code. By the time they get code, it usually too late to change things. We don't give them early code bacause there is nobody to support them. The product teams are currently not staffed to do this and SSBU is always pimped for resources. We do a great job on evanglizing new APIs and technologies, but we are very bad at getting code to the ISVs and supporting them. (just take the OLE case as an example) Getting the ISVs code can be solved by simply sending letters and mailing code.

Supporting pre-release software is the REAL problem here. Clearly SSBU needs to get staffed up to handle this, but they can't do it without money. If we want this to happen, then we need to figure out how to get them money like we do for DSBU. In the Win 3.1 time-frame, we need to get them to the point where they can support 750-1000 ISVs. However, I don't think we should blindly give them money because I think SSBU is operating with some gross inefficiencies. For example: they allocate 45mins to answer an SR they already know the answer to! That's crazv.

Finally, here's my proposal on how to go about solving this mess.

- 1) The importance of this needs to get escalated over to scott okie, over to jonl, and up to steve and bill.
- 2) Each dept involved needs to appoint a hot dog that is capable of understanding the requirements and can come up with solutions.
- 3) The focus of the hot dog team should be to
 - a) weed through the ssbu inefficiencies and come up with some reasonable cost estimates of supporting an ISV in a pre-release.
 - b) figure out how many ISVs need to be supported in each program; OLE, Win 3.1 components, Win 3.1 beta, and future stuff.
 - c) figure out how much money each dept kicks over to SSBU. Some will come from DOS/WIN, some may come sys marketing, I don't really care.
- 4) It's important that the hot dog team be sanctioned from the top since we don't want this effort to get stuck

in the political mud.

5) force the hot dogs to get a proposal in place in 2-3 weeks, and the plan taking place in a month.
