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> during the exec mtg yesterday with AT&T the LM/X and Windows based office solution was discussed. AT&T would like to use Win3 in a "nonvisible" fashion during their announcement currently planned for March 27th.

The following is the background:

The "Conquistador" project has with the top mgmmt support the following plan. AT&T direct sales and support will sell a total solution based on LM/X backbone(Starlan) on AT&T/Intel hardware with the attached nodes being based on the Microsoft Windows 3.0 solution plus Windows apps including WinWord, Excel, Whimper, Powerpoint plus AT&TS Windows Fax and Windows mail. Lotus and Wordperfect will also be offered as secondary options. The emphasis is on the total solution with various degrees of integration and support. What is a far more controversial issue is that AT&T will offer NewWave on top of Windows and they claim that they have developed utilities that enable DDEs for apps to take advantage of NW without being rewritten. This remains to be clarified.

There are two issues:

1. AT&T plans to have a large customer event the 27th of March where they will announce their total solution and demo beta versions(actual ship planned late summer). As Win3 has protect mode and significantly better performance than 2.11 AT&T would like to to use Win3 in a nonvisible fashion. To give them a "day in court" Richab and I had a conf call this PM. We told them we could NOT allow them to pre-announce Win3 althought they claim it would not be visible. As a compromise we suggested that they could demo Conquistador in a backroom under strict NDA to selected customers. I expect that Kavner or O'Shea will call you and ask for your approval by mid next week.

2. We should follow-up with a visible participation of ATST at our Win3 event in April/May.

Concerns:

1. We need to be consistant as we have said no to several people incl Zenith

2. We have a desire to minimize exposure for Win3 before the announce . 3. AT&T cannot use Win3 without showing 3d-look and system fonts

Action items:

Pattye/Jancl to gather input if the above would at all be possible.
We will call Carl Pavarini back next Tuesday with a response.
AT&T invited us to participate in the March 27th(analysts) and April 2nd(customer) events and represent both IM/X, Windows and Winapps.
Richab, Mikemap and Mikemur to advice if this is of interest.

FYI re business arrangements:

Due to internal reorg for the OS group they declined per system Win license and instead they opted for per copy license of \$45 for binary with 20k units commit per year. This leaves us with plenty of room for reneg at a later date for a per system agreement. On the apps side the agreement to be signed is that ATST pays MS the

On the apps side the agreement to be signed is that AT&T pays MS the greater of, 27.5% of SRP for every app they download from the server to client or, 80% times the number of clients attached(ie client software) times \$136. The small min commit over two years is \$1M with the potential of bringing in far more revenues.

Pattye has done an excellent job making this happen and we expect both the Win and Apps agreements to be signed within 3 weeks. X 567519
