SUBJECT: ISV Endorsements

Further to your recent memo of 10 January. I agree entirely with the high priority that you attach to ISV endorsement.

The long term objective is to obtain either box back recommendations or ISV sponsored joint bundling ie. OEM arrangements. These can only be effected at Head Office level and are being driven through by Ken Pomper in the US.

Similarly, ISVs will only "support" DR DOS after it has passed through their QA process. This again is organised in the US, but we are leveraging via the UK. While we cannot obtain " support for DR DOS " statements from the ISVs in the short term, we can and are changing the mindsets of the technical support teams with the resulting in implied recommendations.

To support the US activities we have opened doors for Ken in the US for Ventura (Carol Clement Product Marketing Director), Novell (Mark Griffiths International Marketing Manager) and Lotus (Eileen Rudin - Product Development Manager)

To build credibility in sales regions we are engineering joint activities. To date we have achieved the following:-

Invitation to share joint stand at Networks '91 Exhibition.

Joint Datasheet produced and issued by Novell UK. 4000 corporate end-users in the UK, French translations in hand.

Ventura

- Joint Datasheet produced and being printed. Translation into French underway.
