CAMBRIDGE, Mass., and REDMOND, Wash. -Sept. 15, 1999 - Lotus Development Corp. and Microsoft Corp. today announced their intent to integrate Microsoft® Windows Media<sup>TM</sup> Technologies into Lotus' Notes Release 5 and Domino Release 5 collaboration software products via IBM's HotMedia Connect technology.
